About the program

The Transport Support Volunteer assists the overall activities of MacKillop Family Services through providing children and young people in out of home care with transport to and from a range of activities. This role supports the broader Family Services team in a collaborative and responsive way.

Your Role

As Transport Support Volunteer you will drive young people to and from appointments, school or leisure activities.

You will report to the Coordinator Out of Home Care. This person will meet with you regularly and support you in your volunteer role, coordinating transport activities and facilitating any necessary introductions and transport preparation.

Your Responsibilities as a Transport Support Volunteer may include but are not limited to the following:

• Transporting children and young people to and from appointments and activities

- Building rapport with the children and young people that you are transporting
- Driving in a calm, safe and considered manner
- Ensuring that children feel safe and heard during all interactions
- Interacting with children, young people and carers and the MacKillop Family Services Team to support positive outcomes for children and young people
- Using and maintaining MacKillop vehicles in line with relevant organisational policies

Providing information and notes around the transport activities you provide

What we will do

If you are successful in your application we will support you to undertake the necessary probity checks. We will also provide you with comprehensive training and onboarding as well as access to ongoing support, training, supervision resources, and guidance. We will provide introductions to any young people that you will be transporting to support your engagement with them during the period of transport.

You will be required to

Key selection criteria


The Volunteer Mentor will:

- Have strong communication skills
- Have the ability to build and maintain positive and supportive relationships with the children and young people that are being transported
- Prioritise emotional and physical safety of the children and young people being transported
- Have an understanding of professional boundaries and why these are important
- Hold a current Western Australian drivers license
- Hold or be prepared to obtain required police clearances including but not limited to: Criminal Records Check, Working with Children Check, NDIS Worker Screening Check (if required)


